

Demographic Targetting: Priority Species

Priority terrestrial species for monitoring, separated into those for which we already have good data and improving spatial coverage would increase our ability to interpret demographic trends (by examining regional or habitat variation in demography) and those for which more data would improve the quality of demographic interpretation of population trends. Species marked with an asterisk are likely to be practically more challenging.
